

We couldn't gather at the bedsides of the dying or joyfully kiss the faces of brand-new grandchildren. Over 500,000 lives lost to the virus and millions upended. The losses are great, and the grief is real. Grief anniversaries can sneak up on us. Sometimes our bodies remember, even if our minds don't make the connection. Maybe that's true for you this year.

While this year has been filled with grief, it has also been filled with the creativity and energy that's been required to learn to do things in new ways. Car parades to those in congregate living facilities, monthly donation drop-off events, virtual choir rehearsal, a virtual Christmas pageant, Zoom Sunday school, Zoom coffee hour, Zoom book club, Zoom everything. All reasons to be grateful.

I pray that faith has been a resource for you in these last twelve months. For the past month or so, I have been using a simple breath prayer using words adapted from Psalm 121 to center myself. I'd like to share that practice with you. As I breathe in, I silently say: "I lift my eyes to the hills— from where will my help come?" And as I breathe out, I silently say: "My help comes from God, who made heaven and earth." Maybe this or a similar practice would be useful to you.

Though this has been a difficult year, I am filled with gratitude that we get to navigate these waters together. As we breathe in and out may we all know the love that sustains and empowers us today and always.

### **Purpose of Special Mission Offerings**

United Church of Christ Special Mission Offerings (SMOs) exist to allow congregations and individuals to meet people at points of critical need in their lives. Though many options exist for direct, individual support of these needs, the SMOs allow a common witness and make a collective positive impact. Our church is a "5 for 5" church which indicates our support to UCC's Wider Mission and the four Special Mission Offerings – four areas where critical human needs exist. These offerings sponsor vital ministries that bring hope to people in the U.S. and around the world. The four areas where these critical human needs exist:

- 1. In places lacking health and educational resources and/or where disaster has struck;
- 2. Within systems of injustice which oppress daily life and opportunity;
- 3. In the lives of church leaders without sufficient resources to live with dignity;
- 4. In the nurture of youth and congregations just beginning their lives of faith.

These SMOs collectively serve to lift people closer to the abundance and wholeness to which our faith has called us to work together to bring about.

# Church of the Foothills Open and Affirming Covenant

No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here.

As a community of faith that believes in and strives to live into these words, Church of the Foothills lovingly declares that we are an Open and Affirming congregation in which all people, including persons of every race, ethnic background, age, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, physical or mental ability, socioeconomic background, marital status, and faith background are welcomed and embraced in the full life and work of our church.

We recognize that many people in these communities have often been the target of discrimination and judgment in the name of God, and we consciously choose to renounce said discrimination and judgment by embracing justice and welcoming all people into the full life and communion of our church. Furthermore, we affirm a faith that calls us all into radical kinship with one another and celebrates each individual as a beloved child of God.

We recognize that declaring Church of the Foothills to be Open and Affirming is not the final destination but the continuation of an ongoing journey to seek justice for all of God's children and to love our neighbor as ourselves, in accordance with the teachings of Christ Jesus.

# **Allyship Beyond the Binary**

Expanding the inclusion and affirmation of people that may today be on society's margins takes intentional work on the part of communities of faith.

On February 13, Church of the Foothills held an educational event entitled Allyship Beyond the Binary, focused on improving our understanding of our transgender community, the issues that this community faces and ways in which we can better come into solidarity with our Trans neighbors.

The event included 30 or so of our congregation, several excellent workshops, and was offered by teaching duo, Jude Johnson (They/Them/Theirs), M.Div./CSR, Pacific School of Religion, Member in Discernment, United Church of Christ, and Rowan Queathem, Assistant Director of Inclusion at New England College in New Hampshire.

### **COVID-19 TEAM UPDATE**

March 2021 is here with a brighter outlook as several outdoor activities resume at church and our church family gets vaccinated. I was thinking about that last night as I left CVS with my prescription, when I noticed a man entering the store without a mask. I had to guess he had completed both doses of COVID19 vaccine and thought it was okay.

But here is why he likely was escorted back out of CVS – and more importantly, why all of us need to keep wearing masks and distancing, including when attending church activities. Simply put, we do not know if fully vaccinated people still pose a small risk of transmitting the virus to others, particularly those not yet immune. Experts also remind us that even fully vaccinated people still have some risk of acquiring COVID-19 if exposed (although current vaccines greatly reduce the risk of hospitalization or death). For both these reasons, those COVID precautions will continue awhile.

- 1) Get vaccinated when you can! (And let us know if you need help getting signed up).
- 2) Keep wearing your mask, washing hands frequently, and social distancing.
- 3) Remember limited gatherings outdoors are safer than indoors, especially compared to poorly ventilated indoor spaces. Herd immunity gets closer with every vaccination and when it arrives, we will get back to normal. Thank you, church family, for hanging in there with us. We know "returning to normal" can't happen soon enough!

Your Generosity Continues...

The Outreach and Benevolence Board extends many thanks once again to our church community for all the generous donations. On February 18<sup>th</sup> our monthly "Drive-thru" Food, Clothing and Book Collection at the COTF yielded *33 bags/boxes of food and hygiene products* for Project Understanding and *30 bags/boxes of clothing, shoes, socks and blankets* for the homeless served at the County's One Stop program. In addition, *6 boxes of used books* were collected to help support Friends of the Library.

The County's One Stop program has been fortunate to have many local houses of worship donate clothing and blankets to their homeless clients over the past 3 months. Because of this, they are running out of room for storage and request a short hiatus of donations for the next couple of months. Project Understanding always welcomes non-perishable food, hygiene products, diapers and pet food. There is still a great need there.

Our next monthly event will be **Thursday, March 18**<sup>th</sup> **from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.** At this event, we will only collect for Project Understanding and books for Friends of the Library. We will let you know when clothing donations for the homeless resume.
